## Welcome

Welcome to 2024 Bridgewater Softball! We are extremely thankful to you for volunteering your time to support the league and the players. It should be a rewarding experience for coaches, players and parents.

The number one goal is to have fun and teach the fundamentals of softball (running, throwing, catching, batting and becoming a teammate).

This season will set the foundation for a fun and exciting future in Bridgewater Softball. With this in mind, we have set some goals for the season.

- Each player will learn to properly throw and catch a softball.
- Each Player will be able to hit a ball pitched by an opposing pitcher
- Each player will understand the basics of base running and know every position.
- Each player will expand their vocabulary of the game.
- Each player will learn the proper conduct both on and off the field. This includes staying on the bench while your team is at bat, being a good sport, and learning about being a teammate.


## Managers and Coaches

## REQUIREMENTS

Each team will have a Manager and Assistant Coaches must have the following:

- Rutgers S.A.F.E.T.Y. certification
- Rutgers certification is good for life
- Certification requirement also applies to all parents wishing to help out (i.e. inside the dugout, on the field, etc.)
- Background check
- Must be checked every 2 years

- Please DO NOT submit your background check application until you have been approved to be a manager/coach by your league commissioner

BBSI Rules - Softball Major League ( $\mathbf{6}^{\text {th }}-\mathbf{8}^{\text {th }}$ Graders)

## Rules Highlights

1. Each game consists of $\mathbf{6}$ innings.

- No new inning is to be started after $\mathbf{1}$ hour 45 minutes (No hard stop at 2 hours)

2. Scoring will be kept and Regular season records will be used for seeding in the playoffs.
3. Maximum of five (5) runs per inning, except the final inning when there is no limit
4. There is no mercy rule
5. When a batter gets hit with a pitched ball the umpire will give the batter the option to either take the base $\left(1^{\text {st) }}\right)$ or bat again.
6. Stealing is permitted from second to third only
7. A base runner may NOT lead off a base until the ball leaves the pitchers hand.
8. A base runner cannot steal home on an overthrown throwdown from catcher.
9. 1 base per overthrow, additional overthrows opens additional base, all at runner's risk.

- For example: the ball is hit into play to SS. SS throws the ball wildly to $1 B$ and the ball passes the first basewoman. The runner may advance to second base at her own risk.

10. A pitcher is not to pitch more than three (3) innings per game unless absolutely necessary
11. Infield Fly rule is NOT in effect

Schedule

1. The league commissioner begins to form the teams in March.
2. The Major Softball League schedule will be posted on the Bridgewater softball website.
3. Each game consists of $\mathbf{6}$ innings.
a. No new inning is to be started after $\mathbf{1}$ hour 45 minutes (No hard stop at 2 hours)
4. A manager or coach (preferably both) should be at the field at least 15 minutes prior to game time to greet their players and get organized for the evening.
5. Parents should be instructed to have their children at the field approximately 5-10 minutes before the scheduled time.
6. Players should be instructed not to leave the field during the practice/game.
7. Note: Please instruct parents that any player who cannot make a practice or game should contact the team manager.

## General Rules

1. Except as otherwise noted, we will follow the most current ASA rules and regulations. All managers and coaches should be familiar with these rules.
2. Maximum of five (5) runs per inning, except the final inning when there is no limit
3. There is no mercy rule
4. One umpire will be provided for all games.
5. Only players registered in the recreation program may play in the games. No substitute players are allowed at any time - this includes any siblings of players. There are no exceptions to this rule at any time during the season.
6. All players are to be included at all times.
7. Umpires have the final say regarding all field calls. Please respect the umpire and his calls.
8. All players must remain on the bench at all times unless they are in the field or up to bat. No sitting with parents.
9. No one other than players and coaches should be in the bench area.
10. Scoring will be kept and Regular season records will be used for seeding in the playoffs. Ties will be settled by: a) head-to-head record; and then b) commissioner coin flip. Runs scored/allowed will NOT be used.
11. There is no eating during a practice or game. Drinks are okay. Snacks and drinks can be consumed at the end of the evening.

## Rules of Conduct

1. All managers, coaches, and other volunteers must read, and abide with the Bridgewater Softball Code of Conduct (form is found at the end of this document).
2. It is the responsibility of the manager to maintain proper decorum and behavior among the parents of the players as well as the players and coaches on his team.
3. Any abuse directed at a player by anyone involved with the team is ultimately the responsibility of the manager.
4. Instances of unacceptable behavior should be addressed by the manager immediately and reported to the commissioner for follow-up.
5. Coaches or any other team assistants not coaching first base or third base must stay in the bench area.
6. The use of alcohol, tobacco, or foul language on or around the playing field is not allowed and will not be tolerated.

*** Manager/Coaches - Important ***
```

This is a game for the kids. We are volunteers here to support the kids. Let's be patient. Mistakes will be made. Let's set a good example for the kids on how we handle them. Encourage good sportsmanship and be positive.

Report any incidents to your commissioner immediately. They will be recorded and reviewed by the Board to see if necessary action needs to be taken during the season.

Any major incidents will be taken into consideration upon applying to manage or coach for the following season.

Roster Rules

1. If there are more than 10 players, the players should be on the bench or being instructed with coaches on the side.
2. If one team is short on players, players from the competing team can be shared on a rotating basis each inning.
3. The shared players should play the outfield only \& will only bat on their own team not on the team short on players.

## FAIR PLAYING TIME RULE

No player may sit two innings until every player has sat one complete inning.
a. The intent of this rule is to prevent players from playing the whole game while other players sit 2-3 innings a game.
b. Except for injury, no player sits two consecutive innings.
c. No player may sit more than two innings in any game including ones which go beyond the standard 6 innings.
d. After six innings a player may sit a third inning provided every player has sat at least two (2) innings already.
e. If there is an exception, the manager will be expected to justify it.


If a manager intends to sit a player for an entire game for disciplinary/behavioral reasons or injury, this must be declared to the umpire and to the opposing manager before the game.
a. If a behavioral problem occurs during a game, the player's manager must immediately notify the opposing manager and the umpire of the benching and must notify the Commissioner that day.
a. If a behavioral problem occurs during a practice, the Commissioner must be told before the next game about the intent to have that player sit out the game.
b. If the reason is disciplinary, the player's family and the Commissioner must be notified. Discipline problem is defined as a behavioral problem that occurs during a game or practice, and is unduly disruptive in the opinion of his manager.

## Batting

1. All players will bat, regardless if they are playing the field or not.
2. All players in attendance at the game when it starts will be in a continuous batting order.
3. Anyone arriving after the start of the game will be placed at the end of the line-up.
4. Bunting is permitted.
5. When a batter gets hit with a pitched ball the umpire will give the batter the option to either take the base $\left(1^{\text {st) }}\right)$ or bat again.
6. All players remain on the bench when their team is up.
7. Only ONE person at a time in the batting cage and wearing a helmet.
8. Players cannot swing bats outside of batter's box when warming up.

## Base Running

1. A base runner may NOT lead off a base until the ball leaves the pitchers hand.
2. Stealing is permitted from second to third only
3. A base runner cannot steal home on an overthrown throwdown
4. At the end of a play, runners may not advance once the pitcher has control of the ball within the vicinity of the mound
5. 1 base per overthrow, additional overthrows opens additional base, all at runner's risk.

- For example: the ball is hit into play to SS. SS throws the ball wildly to $1 B$ and the ball passes the first basewoman. The runner may advance to second base at her own risk.

6. A player is allowed to slide, but the must slide rule will not be enforced

## Pitching

1. Pitching rubber: should measure 40 feet from the back of home plate
2. Only the players will pitch during games - coaches will not be allowed to pitch
3. Pitchers should start their delivery with one foot on the rubber
4. A coach may use his/her discretion to move a pitcher in by no more than one foot if a pitcher is missing the plate
5. The pitcher must finish their delivery within the pitching circle
6. Players who are not able to reach the plate from one foot in front of the pitching mound will not be allowed to pitch. This is a safety issue for pitchers, catcher and batter. There are no exceptions
7. A pitcher change is recommended if there are four (4) consecutive batters walked or hit during the same inning up to the coach's discretion
8. A pitcher is not to pitch more than three (3) innings per game unless absolutely necessary
9. Pitchers must wear a fielding mask. No exceptions. Position players are not required to wear a fielding mask but is it highly recommended, especially young and inexperienced players.

## Fielding

- Field Size: Base paths should measure $\mathbf{6 0}$ feet
- There is a three (3) out or maximum of five (5) runs per inning
- Maximum of 10 players on the field for defense
- Infield Positions: 1B, 2B, 3B, SS, C \& P
- Outfield Positions: LF, LC, RC, RF. (Outfielders are to be placed on or beyond 15 feet from the bases or be on the grass area of the outfield. Don't position players to appear to have 2 sets of infielders. Standing behind a $2^{\text {nd }}$ base is not a position
- Important: Unless there is a safety issue, players should be rotated to some different positions in the field so they can learn multiple positions
- Infield Fly Rule is NOT in effect.
- Coaches shall not be placed on the field during play.
- Players should be permitted to make all fielding plays. Coaches should not interfere with any ball that is in play.


## Equipment

1. Only equipment approved for use by the Bridgewater Softball Leagues shall be used in practices, clinics or games
2. All helmets, including pitchers, must have a face guard/cage. Helmets without a cage cannot be used
3. Players must wear their full uniforms (pants, shirt, socks, and hat) during games. Shorts are not acceptable
4. Players must bring their own glove and are welcomed to bring a bat
5. We strongly urge parents to write the players name and phone number on all equipment
6. Only ASA approved bats may be used
7. Players should wear plastic spikes. Sneakers and soccer spikes are fine Opened-toed foot apparel is not permitted. No metal cleats
8. A twelve inch "hard" ball will be used for all practices \& games
9. Players should dress appropriately based on weather conditions, cold, heat, rain, etc.
10. Players should bring their own water on hot days
11. Although a fielding mask is not mandatory for position players (it is mandatory for pitchers), it is highly recommended

## Major League Skills Training

Keep it Simple and Make it Fun! - Skills should be taught all season long. Be creative, have contests, goals, etc.

## Running

1. Run to each base and make proper turns for extra bases
2. Touch each Base
3. Run through first base. Don't slide into first base

Drill: Run through First Base. Run from First to Second. Run from Second to Home

## Fielding

1. Good stance - wide stance and knees bent
2. Glove and hand out in front
3. Use both hands to catch the ball

Drill: Have the players field gently rolled ground balls without a glove and throw back. Repeat with glove

## Hitting

1. Good stance - Shoulder width and feet square to the plate
2. Hands back and stay balanced, load without a hitch
3. Push the hands back and small step straight towards the pitcher
4. Keep the head steady and watch the ball as you swing

Drill: Soft toss hitting practice with Wiffle balls into the fence


Throwing

1. Eyes on target.
2. Get the ball back up high and behind the head
3. Point your glove and step towards the target

Drill: Soft toss back forth with one knee on the ground

## Pitching

1. Pair pitchers and catchers together.
2. Have catchers in full gear and start at half distance
3. Increase distance every 10 pitches until full distance is achieved
4. Rotate in catchers and pitchers

## Outfield

1. Glove up for fly balls. First step is always back.
2. In front of the ball for grounders
3. Throw to second base
4. Do not hold or run with the ball

Drill: Have a coach toss short fly balls (6 feet away) to catch. Throw to second Repeat with grounders

## Rain Outs \& Lightning Policy

1. In order to determine if a game is cancelled due to weather, please check http://www.bridgewaterbsi.com under the Field Conditions tab or call the recreation department hotline at 908-526-7107, after 4:00pm.
2. The web site will say "Open" or "Closed". If closed, please contact the other manager to confirm the cancellation and then contact your parents. Email communication is the recommended way and probably the most efficient way to communicate
a. If games have not been canceled, the two managers should show up at the field or contact each other to make a determination as to whether the game could be played.
3. It is highly encouraged to make-up rain out games in Majors softball and is the responsibility of both coaches to find a suitable time and reschedule with the league scheduler.
4. In case of LIGHTNING, a thirty (30) minute postponement applies to all current games at a specific location. All people must seek shelter (in vehicles). If after thirty (30) minutes, lightning is still sighted, a Board Member, Commissioner, or a Senior Umpire can decide to cancel the game(s).
5. If lightning returns after play has resumed, the thirty (30) minute postponement starts over. The time limit for the game will remain in force during the lightning delay - no extra time will be granted for the delay for recreation games.
6. The cancellation of an earlier game, due to lightning, does not necessarily cancel all later games.
